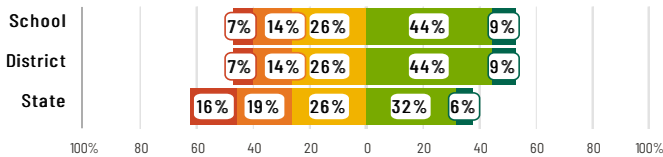

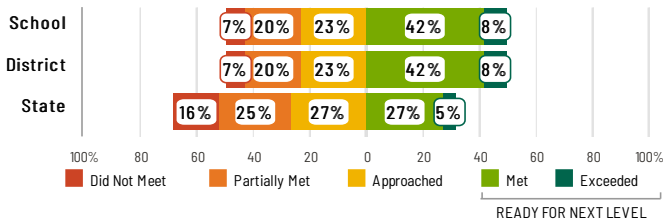
Academic Success

English Language Arts



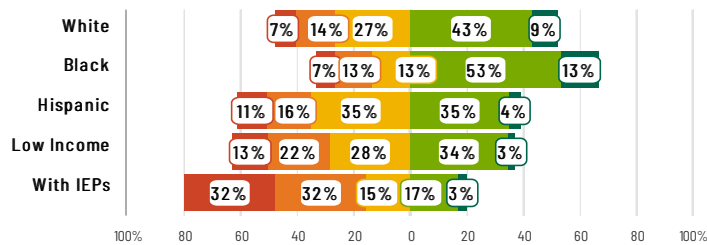

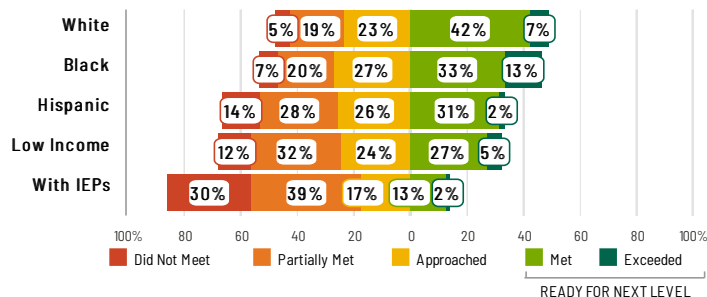
Success by Student Group

Student Attendance and Mobility

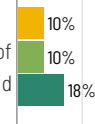
Attendance Rate

Rate at which students are present at school, not including excused or unexcused absences



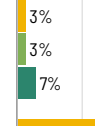
Chronic Absenteeism

Percentage of students who miss 10% or more of school days per year either with or without a valid excuse



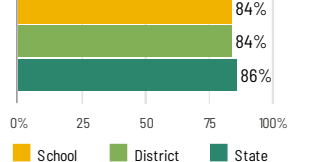
Student Mobility

School Highlights

Academic Courses

Park View's focus on highly rigorous academic offerings is apparent throughout the Pre-k through eighth grade experience. Warriors have opportunities to participate in our award-winning band and orchestra programs. Our successful ELL and enrichment (PEP) programs support a wide variety of learners. Summer School is also offered at Park View.

Physical Education, Health and Wellness

The Park View Physical Education Department has been awarded an unprecedented 5th Blue Ribbon Award from the Illinois Association of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance. Students learn about health and fitness from all aspects and frequently utilize some of the most advanced technology available.

Other Programs and Activities

Park View has a rich tradition of success with our Science Olympiad Program, available to 5-8th graders. Our Yearbook Club consistently publishes excellent yearbooks each year. Broadcasting Club fosters budding journalists with streaming broadcasts. Fourth through eighth grade have after school opportunities to support homework completion.

School Awards

Awards granted at Park View have a focus on sportsmanship, excellence, and service to the community. Awards include: Judy Porst Award (service), Julie Stix Award (band, orchestra and choir), Elmer Urbe Award, Iron Warrior Award, Outstanding PE Student Award, and the American Legion Award.

Career Development Courses and Programs

Athletics

Park View's athletics programs are of the highest quality. Coaches focus on techniques, fitness, and most importantly, sportsmanship. Soccer, Volleyball, Basketball, cross-country, and cheerleading are available to our middle school students. A variety of intramural opportunities are also open to our younger students.

School Personnel Resources

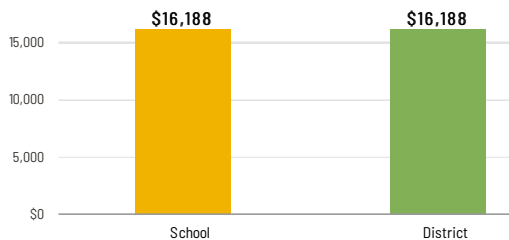
Park View has highly qualified ELL teachers, social workers, information literacy/technology specialists, and special education staff to support the needs of all students. New in 2014-15, Park View has a Literacy Coach and Technology Integration Coach to help support all staff in addressing students' growth.

Facilities

In 2014-15, Park View has added on 5 additional classrooms to help accommodate increasing enrollment, as well as housing a new Blended Preschool Program and NTDSE classroom. There are 3 gyms, a multi-purpose room, a STEM Lab, 2 music rooms, and different spaces for small group learning throughout the building.

School-Level Finance

The Every Student Succeeds Act requires LEAs to report school-level expenditure data, beginning with School Year 18-19 data.
