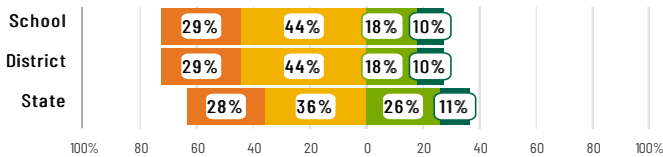

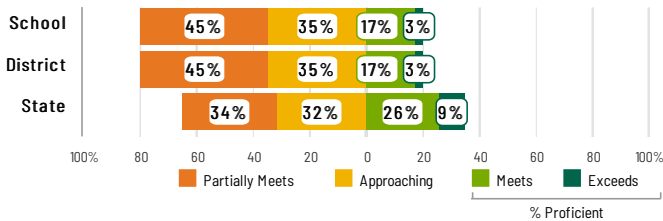

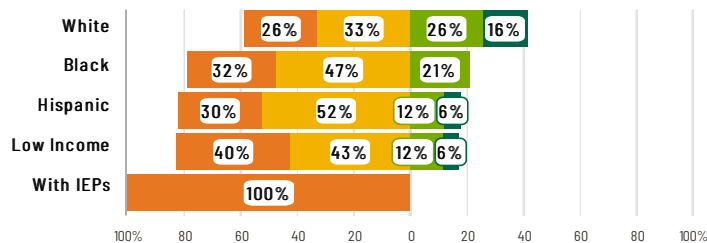

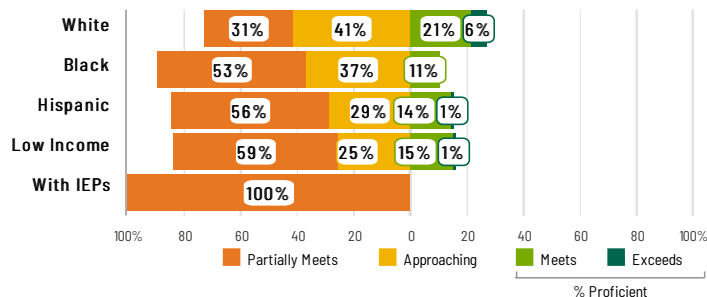
Success by Student Group

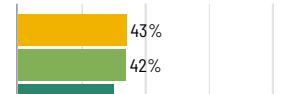

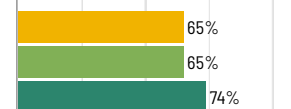
Early College Coursework

Students taking early college coursework in grades 10, 11, and 12



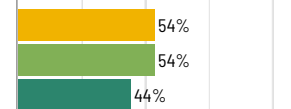
Postsecondary Enrollment

Academic Courses

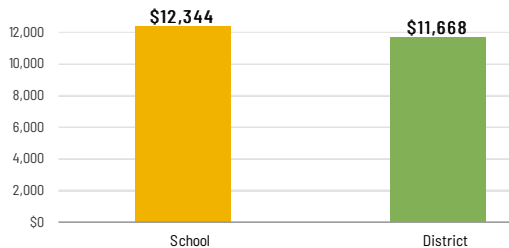

Facilities

The current Plano High School was built in two phases. The first is a 1977 addition, with two floors, including the central piece of the building including two stories of classrooms, the cafeteria and main gym. The 2007 addition encompasses a state of the art auditorium, office areas, athletic and co-curricular areas.

School-Level Finance

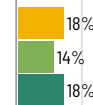
Attendance Rate

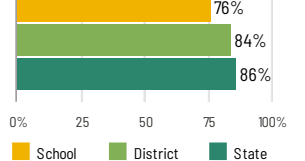
Student Mobility
