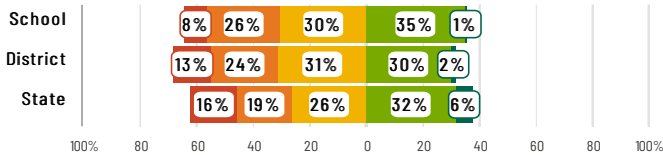

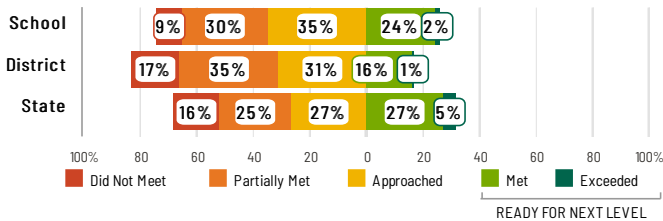
Academic Success

English Language Arts



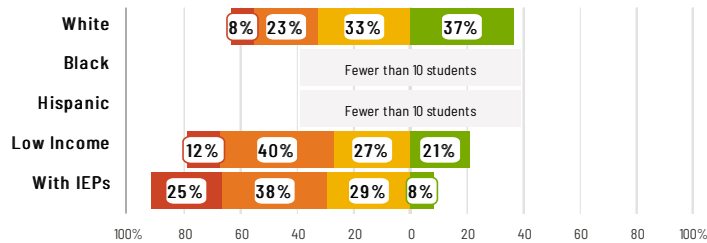

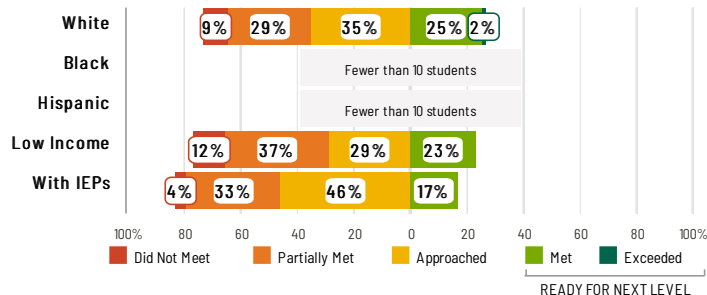
Success by Student Group

This display shows IAR ELA & Math performance levels for each student group. No data is shown for groups with fewer than 10 students.

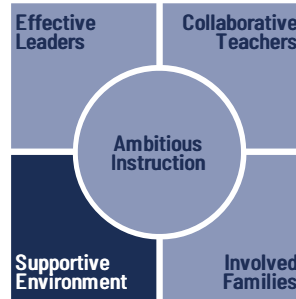
English Language Arts



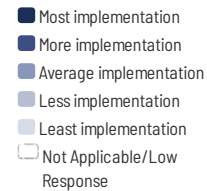

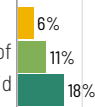
Attendance Rate

Rate at which students are present at school, not including excused or unexcused absences



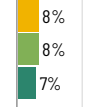
Chronic Absenteeism

School Highlights

Academic Courses

The Apollo curriculum is tied into the Common Core Standards. Grades kindergarten through third grade are self contained outside of their daily specials (Art, Music and PE) class. The Apollo schedule is broken into a repetitive A day, B day, C day, rotation. Every student has PE every day and Art and Music every third day.

Physical Education, Health and Wellness

Every student has PE every day. Our PE teacher is highly qualified. All students have an opportunity for multiple recesses every day including one before school that ends when the morning bell rings. Students learn about healthy habits as part of our science and PE curriculum.

Other Programs and Activities

Apollo has an onsite after school program that is offered through the local YMCA. The YMCA also offers our third graders swimming lessons through a grant. The YMCA and Apollo cooperate to offer students different athletic programs by sharing facilities and helping distribute information. We also partner with the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts.

School Awards

Apollo Elementary was presented with the prestigious Academic Excellence Award in 2012 by the Illinois State Board of Education. We were the only school to earn this in our ROE and one of just a few outside of Chicago and the collar counties.

Career Development Courses and Programs

Apollo Elementary has a Makerspace in the Learning Resource Center. This is a project based hands on laboratory. Students are able to design and build in this space. There are opportunities for working with robotics and some basic computer coding.

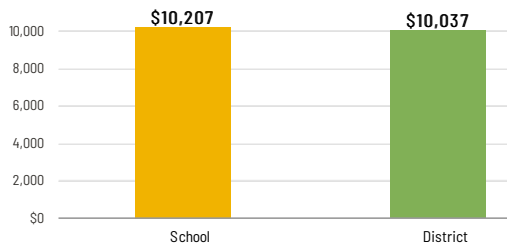

Apollo is a one story building that was built in 1971. Since then there have been two additions added. There is a music room, an art room and a gymnasium that also serves as our cafeteria and auditorium with an adjacent stage. We have a large activity room for the after school program and indoor recess. We also have an enclosed courtyard.
