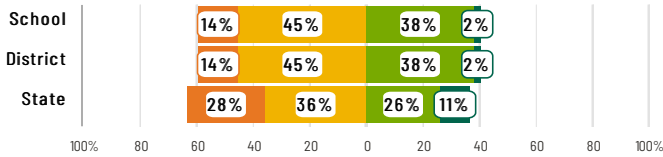

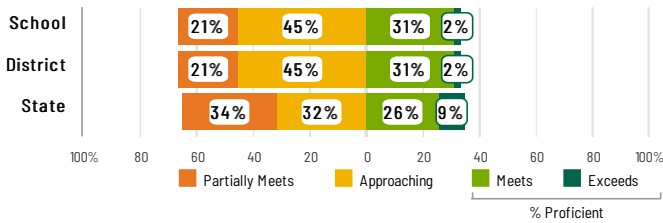

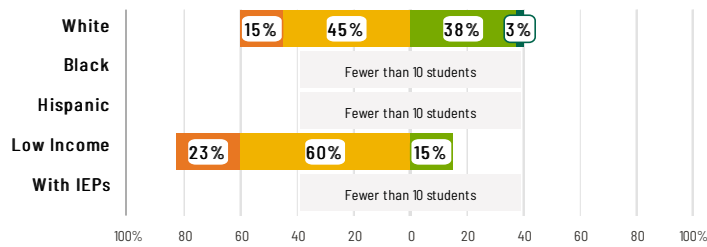

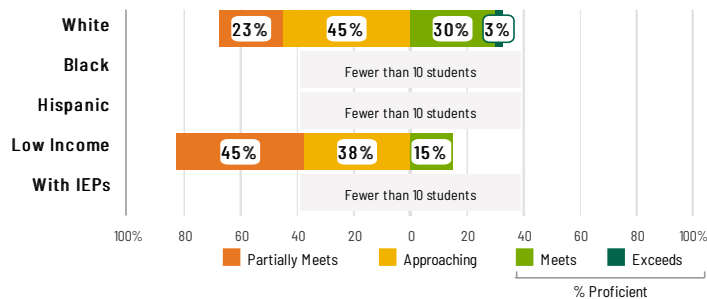
Success by Student Group

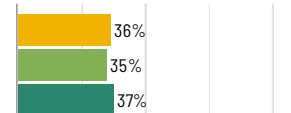

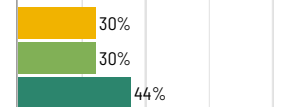
Postsecondary Enrollment

Academic Courses

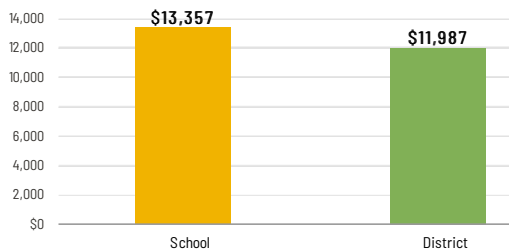

Facilities

Amboy High School has new gym facilities as of 2021 with air conditioning throughout most of the academic wing. We have two agriculture shops that are used for welding, small engine maintenance, and construction.
